

Alumni Association Committee Duties

The Committee shall consist of 8-10 volunteers who have an interest in actively participating in the Alumni Association Committee of the School District #9 D-9 Foundation. At least one representative will be a D-9 Foundation Board Director, one representative will be from the Eagle Center, one will be another staff member of EPHS, and a representative from the active alumni groups who elect to utilize the 501(c)3 benefits of the Foundation shall be included on the committee.

The Committee will hold monthly meetings that will align with the school calendar.

The Committee shall be an integral part of the D-9 Foundation, and responsible to the D-9 Foundation Board of Directors.

The Committee shall elect a chairperson, an assistant chairperson, and a secretary. Thereafter, the chair will retire after one year of service and the assistant chairperson will assume the role of chair. An assistant chair and a secretary will be elected to complete the set of officers. Officer elections will be held in January of each year.

The goals of the Alumni Association Committee shall be;

- 1) facilitators for other active alumni groups (as listed below) and
- 2) information disseminators to increase awareness of our graduates as well as provide information about the D-9 Foundation.

The other alumni groups, may remain autonomous organizations, and though they are encouraged to cooperate and participate with the Alumni Association Committee, are not subject to its actions. However, if the groups elect to utilize the 501(c)3 organization benefits of the Foundation in their fund raising or grant seeking endeavors, then they will become a integral part of the Foundation and will work closely with the D-9 Foundation Board of Directors.

To achieve goal 1, the Alumni Association Committees primary responsibility shall be the establishment and maintenance of a database of class members/graduates of School District #9. The database will be stored in the Access Format on the main frame server at Eagle Point High School and will be password protected. This data would then be made available to the D-9 Foundation and active alumni groups who have submitted requests and have received approval from the D-9 Foundation Board of Directors to receive selective data.

To achieve goal 2, a newsletter from the Alumni Association Committee shall be distributed to all interested parties at least twice annually. The newsletter will focus on historical school news, alumni news, D-9 Foundation goals and news, as well as information about our D-9 schools that perhaps out of area graduates may not be aware. Sponsors will be sought to defray the cost of publication and mailing and if desired, their ads will appear in the newsletter.
